For one thing, I am enclosing a copy of our Constitution and By-Laws for all Chapters and Student Councils. You will note that there is considerable autonomy for an organization our size. We try and let all Chapters operate according to the local requirements. Naturally, there a minimul regulations which must be met. (All Chapters can receive literature in bulk at a discounted rate and resell at the retail price and use the proceeds for further Chapter activities. Credit is extended and payment is not required with the cruer. We do expect payment within a reasonable period so that we may continue our end of the operation. It would be hard to concieve of a chapter with as few members as seem to exist in the New Orleans area. I have just gone through our files and find that Lousiana seems somewhat restricted for Fair Play activities. However, with what is there purhaps you could build a larger group if a few people would undertake the disciplined responsibility of concrete organizational work. We certainly are not at all adverse to a very small Chapter but certainly would expect that there would be at least twice the amount needed to conduct a legal executive board for the Chapter. August, 1962:

August 2, 1963, Friday: Two Cubans visit Bringuier at his store and tell him of a training camp for anti-Castro soliders on Lake Ponchartrain. They tell him that they think the group was infiltrated by pro-Castro forces. Bringuier nervous about that.

August 5, 1963, Monday: Oswald enters 107 Decatur Street, NO, LA Casa Roca (clothes store), Carlos Bringuier, manager Oswalds says he is anti-Castro and a Marine; he wants to join DRE. Bringuier is wary. He tells Oswald not yet.

August 9, 1963, Friday: Oswald hands out leaflets at 700 Canal Street.

Carlos Bringuier incident. FPCC leaflet stamped with PO Box and AJ Hidell.

A friend tells Bringuier that this guy is out on the streets screaming, "Viva Fidel," while handing out pamphlets. Bringuier tracks him down and seess it is Oswald. A scuffle ensues. Both are arrested.

August 12, 1963, Monday: Oswald and Bringuier appear in court. Oswald pleads guilty and fined \$10. Bringuier pleads not guilty: charges dismissed.

August 16, 1963, Friday: Oswald hands out leaflets at the Trade Mart. Intersection of Camp and Common Streets.


531 Lafayette : Guy Banister's address.

Carlos Bringuier is a young lawyer, Cuban refugee, anti-Castro, head of the DRE chapter in NO, LA. He is working as a store mananger at Casa Roca, a clothing store.

Mr. LIEBELER. I am correct in understanding, am I not, that you have been involved to one degree or another in Anti-Castro activities here in New Orleans since your arrival?

Mr. BRINGUIER. Yes, sir; soon after I arrived here to New Orleans, I founded a Newsletter for the Cubans with the name of Crusada. That was my first work here in New Orleans. After that I joined, at the beginning of 1962, the New Orleans Delegation of the Cuban Revolutionary Council, and I was working as Secretary of Publicity and Propaganda here in New Orleans for the Cuban Anti-Castro. That was, I believe, June or July--June 1962. After that, I resigned, and in July 1962 I was designated New Orleans delegate of the Cuban Student Directorate, and I am in that position from that time to now.

Office of the CRC was at 544 Camp Street, the address that was on Oswald's FPCC leaflet.


